Topic

the specific topic of your research; what you're going to look up

I am interested in researching...

Question

what question you're trying to solve by getting that information

...because I want to understand...

Significance

why it's important; the broader implications; so what?

... , which is important because it helps us better understand...

I am interested in researching the early modern religious significance of fish [TOPIC] **because I want to understand** what it means to call Caliban a fish in Shakespeare's *The Tempest* [QUESTION], **which is important because it helps us better understand** Shakespeare's possible Catholicism. [SIGNIFICANCE]

I am interested in researching stories of the Alamo because I want to understand why voters responded to them in ways that served the interests of local Texas politicians, which is important because it helps us better understand how regional self-images influence national politics.

I am interested in researching the 1961 and 1998 versions of the film *The Parent Trap* **because I want to understand** how the character of the mother changes between the two films, **which is important because it helps us better understand** how depictions of mothers in film changed in the last part of the 20th-century.

I am interested in researching Edna St. Vincent Millay's experience with Spanish-speaking cultures because I want to understand the setting of her 1920 poem "Recuerdo," which is important because it helps us better understand Anglo-Hispanic relations after World War I.

I am interested in researching early Tudor deer-hunting practices because I want to better understand how the metaphor of deer hunting works in Thomas Wyatt's poem "Whoso List to Hunt," which is important because it helps us better understand the social implications of men and women who compare themselves to hunted animals in literary texts.
