5. Disseminate their research and course modules/lessons widely through conferences,

publications, and website sharing

In order to successfully include South Korean and Asian perspectives in the participants' teaching, SKALE seeks to ensure that participants who complete this project:

1. Can converse in basic Korean conversations to communicate effectively

2. Know the current Korean cultural trends taking place in South Korea and the rest of the world

3. Have a broad understanding of Korean historical perspectives

4. Are competent representatives of the Korean culture in the classes they teach based on experiential learning activities overseas

5. Are effective ambassadors of the educational, political, economic, and social mindsets taking place in South Korea as these pertain to American lifestyles
