Through memoranda of understanding with international universities, USCB cultivates and strengthens opportunities for students to begin their undergraduate education in their home countries and then transfer to USCB to complete their degrees. 

At USCB, we highlight the importance of an internationally focused education. USCB is proud to announce that we are bucking the trend of study abroad participants and international students. In 2019-2020, the number of study

The USCB data on international students attending the university has also continuously increased from the national average post-Covid. International-themed community presentation



On September 28th, Dr. Alvarez presented the convergence of art enjoyment and academics through engaging in the Korean Wave that can sharpen the mind. With the boost in Korean entertainment found on United States media platforms (i.e., Netflix, Disney Plus), learning Korean culture and entertainment can also activate different areas of the mind by engaging with foreign language materials. Duolingo, a free language-learning app, can increase mind activity, while also having fun learning a new language. With the impacts that Korean culture and economy have, the materials pertained to how we can use entertainment as a way to learn about a global culture, engage with their language, and expand the capabilities of our minds. Transatlantic Mobility Program (TMP) - French Embassy Grant



In May 2022, 8 students studied in France after

USCB was one of six universities selected for the 2021-2022 Transatlantic Mobility Program grant. The students (Kaylee Aiken, Kai Bangs, Kari Dennis, Jessica Garcia Zena, Jules Duterte, Jarrett Kizer, Madelyn Morzenti, and Sherry Rodriguez) and Dr. Alvarez had the life-changing experience of being able to travel across the Atlantic to study in Paris. For 4 weeks, the group expanded their knowledge of Parisian culture both inside the classroom and by engaging with the environment. USCB is so grateful to the French Embassy of the United States for providing these students with the opportunity for this life-changing experience. Link

Three of those students who attended the Maymester in Paris (Kai Bangs, Jules Duterte, and Kaylee Aiken) are members of the Beaufort College Honors program. Not only were they able to receive funds from the Transatlantic Mobility Program to aid in their travels, but they also received additional funds from the Honors Office for their trip. We are so grateful to have had 3 members of the honors college join in on the French experience. Link

When the students were in the classroom, they were learning about how immigration to France has shaped the country's culture, politics, and economy in a course called "French Francophone Pluralities". Outside of the classroom, the students saw famous sites (who could go to Paris and not visit the Eiffel Tower?!) as well as local hidden gems that are popular with locals but not with most tourists. The group was also able to explore outside of Paris and visited other French cities as well as a few other European cities (i.e., London, Dublin, etc.). When the student's returned back to the States, their beaming smiles could speak a thousand words about how amazing their study abroad experience was. Link


