USCB offers a way to complete your bachelor's degree in Business Administration through classes held during non-work day hours – nights, online and weekends. Courses focus on key business functions, allowing students to understand issues facing all managers – leadership, human resources, marketing, finance and strategic management in large and small businesses.

ENTRANCE COMPETENCIES

To be considered for admission, students are required to have a GPA of 2.0. In addition to Business courses, General Education/Program courses are necessary for graduation. A one term course typically equals 3 or 4 credit hours. The NOW plan accepts transfer credits from accredited institutions.

While a number of General Education/Program courses are elective, specific requirements minimally include:

English [Composition I, II & Literature]	6 cr hrs
Mathematics [College Algebra & Calculus]	6 cr hrs
Computer Info Systems in Business	3 cr hrs
Communication/Business Speech	3 cr hrs
History	3 cr hrs
Fine Arts (Architecture, Art History, Music, or Theater)	3 cr hrs
Global/Multicultural Studies	3 cr hrs
Foreign Language (Spanish or French)	6 cr hrs
Natural Sciences , one with Lab (BIOL, CHEM, PHYS, MSCI)	7 cr hrs
Microeconomics & Macroeconomics	6 cr hrs

Should students not have all of these General Education transfer requirements, they may take the required courses in the evening, online, weekday or on Saturday. These courses can be taken before, during or after the NOW business course schedule based on prerequisite requirements.
