# **Synopses of Research in Progress**

Sibling Impact on Child Growth and Development: In the course, Child Growth and Development (EDPY B333) in Fall 2022, students asked how sibling relationships influence children's growth and development. After researching this, I designed a longitudinal (exempt through IRB) to explore the relationship between children and their siblings. This research began in May, 2023. The first data set is currently being analyzed.

- **Family Literacy Development:** In order to support caregivers' possible need to foster more complex language development in their homes, I wrote *Talking Over Text* (2017), a family literacy program in which parents learn strategies for talking to their children about text. Validation data are currently being collected. Initial analysis suggests that parents' quality of talk about text during reading improves after training received in the *Talking Over Text* program. This program is provided free to organizations interested in providing support for family literacy.
- **Improved Instructional Practice:** With the event of COVID-19 in the Spring of 2020, teachers were thrust into a digital world that few were fully prepared for. In collaboration with Clemson University's COVID Challenge, I worked with undergraduate students exploring the impact the sudden move to online learning has had on first and second year teachers. This work led to a larger exploration of teachers' experiences in ongoing survey research. It is hoped publications based on this exploration will enable the researchers to make recommendations to school districts and institutions of higher education for supporting teachers' needs.
