CHALLENGE EXAM FAQ

Q: If I want course credit through challenge exam, can I take the test to see how I do and then pay if I pass? No. If you are serious about earning course credit through the challenge exam(s) and believe you have the skills to do so, you must pay for the challenge exam in advance.

Q: I don't care about earning course credit; I just want to take the two foreign language classes I need at USCB. Do I have to pay for the challenge exam? No, you do <u>not</u> have to pay if you're not challenging for course credit.

Q: I placed into a higher-level course and I think the results are accurate; do I still have to take the challenge exam? If you want to take the class you placed into, then <u>YES</u>, you must take the challenge exam. If you do not, the instructor will remove you from the higher-level class.

Q: I placed into a higher-level course but I don't feel comfortable taking it; do I still have to take the challenge exam or can I just take a lower-level class? If you want to take a class that's lower than what you placed into, you do <u>NOT</u> have to take a challenge exam. Simply enroll in the lower-level course.

Q: Is the challenge exam just one exam? No. Technically there is a challenge exam for every lower-level course, so one exam for SPAN/FREN 101, one exam for SPAN/FREN 102, one SPAN/FREN 201, etc. If you place into a higher-level course, and want to enroll in it, you're supposed to challenge every lower-level course that you've exempted. For example, if your placement score says you should enroll in FREN 202, and that's what you want to take, then you need to take a challenge exam for FREN 101, FREN 102, and FREN 201.
