WHAT IS OLLI?

OLLI is the acronym for the prestigious Osher Lifelong Learning Institute offered at 120+ Universities throughout the country. OLLI provides intellectual, social, and cultural enrichment opportunities in a climate that fosters friendship and a mutual sharing of ideas and life experiences.

MISSION

The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) at the University of South Carolina Beaufort (USCB) is devoted to creating and sustaining a robust and thriving lifelong learning community specifically developed for adults 50 and older through intellectual and social programs.

WHY JOIN OLLI?

People who are active, engaged in their communities, and who continue learning throughout their lives feel more productive and purposeful, and are healthier and happier. Members share common bonds of intellectual curiosity and the experience of their generation. They are self-motivated learners, eager to share opinions, knowledge, and expertise with humor and mutual respect. OLLI offers opportunities to meet new friends, make contacts, and develop connections. In addition to lectures, members can attend social events, take field trips, and participate in a myriad of other short courses that better one's quality of life, providing a personal sense of health, engagement, and overall well-being.

WHO TEACHES THE COURSES?

OLLI's philosophy is "teach your passion." Our volunteer instructors are fellow lifelong learners, just like you. They may teach topics related to those they pursued before retirement or may share their knowledge in a new area of interest.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

Members can choose between an UNLIMITED or PAYGO option. Unlimited allows a member to take as many classes within that term as they wish for just \$130. PAYGO allows members to pay per class for just \$16. Summer classes are FREE for OLLI members.

OLLI Glossary of Terms

FIRST SERVED REGISTRATION: A program filled by members who register first.

IN-PERSON: Physical attendance in a USCB OLLI classroom in Beaufort, Bluffton, and Hilton Head Island.

LIMITED ENROLLMENT: Limited number of attendees based on instructor preference or location.

LIVESTREAM: Live transmission of a class between OLLI regions.

OFFSITE: Class/tour/trip not on campus but at a location that will be disclosed in the class reminder email.

OLLI DIGITAL LIBRARY (ODL): Access to previously recorded classes on a video library via the internet anytime during the term.

OSHER ONLINE: Additional learning opportunity via ZOOM run by the Osher National Resource Center in Chicago(additional fees apply) for USCB OLLI members.

** PAYGO: Pay for each class separately upon registration.

RANDOM DRAW: The registration method for selected limited enrollment classes. Anyone can register until a certain date and then a random drawing, via computer software, to select participants. Those not selected go on the waitlist.

ART100: PASTELS & PLEIN AIR DRAWING

2 Sessions | Fridays | Oct 24, 31 3-5PM | In-Person | Beaufort Campus

Immerse yourself in nature, just like Édouard Monet, as you explore the vibrant art of pastels and plein air drawing. "Plein air" is a French term meaning "painting in the open air." This technique involves rendering landscapes outdoors while observing your surroundings. In this course, we will focus on compositional strategies, pastel drawing techniques, and color theory. Students will sketch, plan, and create a finished pastel drawing of the beautiful Lowcountry landscape.

ART101: THE ART OF NORMAN ROCKWELL

As the premier illustrator for The Saturday Evening Post for nearly half a century, no other American artist was more popular with the public than Norman Rockwell. Despite his easy-going, pipe-smoking facade, he was a lonely man who suffered from depression. This course will explore the life and art of America's unofficial "artist in chief" and the unique and lasting contribution he made to American art.

ART102: THE ZENTANGLE METHOD OF DRAWING

"Yoga for the brain. Meditation on paper. Mesmerizing repetition of marks and patterns." These are just a few ways Zentangles are described. This creative practice proves that everyone can draw. Learn the methods developed by Maria Thomas and Rick Roberts and create "Artist Trading Cards" using Zentangle tiles and a Micron pen to produce unique and expressive designs.

ART103: THE HISTORY OF THE GOTHIC CATHEDRAL

The fall of the Western Roman Empire forced European Christians to start anew in building construction technology. Additionally, they faced the challenge of designing buildings that could accommodate new Christian worship practices and iconography derived directly from the Bible. These dual challenges led to the development of what we now refer to as the Gothic cathedral. This program will focus on the evolution of this architectural style in the geographic region of France known as the Île-de-France, culminating in the current reconstruction of the Notre-Dame Cathedral.

MUS104: AMERICANA AT ITS BEST BLUEGRASS MUSIC

The roots of bluegrass trace back to the ancient English, Irish, and Scottish melodies brought to America and transformed by settlers in North and South Carolina, Tennessee, and Kentucky into new songs about life in the hills. Bill Monroe, the "father of bluegrass," blended these sounds with elements of gospel and Mississippi Delta blues to create his signature style, which he brought to the stage of the Grand Ole Opry in 1945. Monroe, Lester Flatt and Earl Scruggs, and Carter and Ralph Stanley are considered bluegrass royalty. Movies including Bonnie & Clyde, Deliverance, and O Brother, Where Art Thou? increased the music's popularity. Tap your feet and enjoy this exciting class!

Following the tour, led by trained docents in period clothing, a reception will be held in the Fellowship Hall, where various documents and artifacts will be on display.

During this visit, attendees will tour the site with a park ranger to explore how the story of Fort Pulaski is written in the bricks – huge craters and embedded artillery projectiles demonstrate the power of rifled cannons; fingerprints preserved in the bricks speak to the institution of slavery and the fight for freedom; soldier graffiti and paintings on the walls connect us to historic figures who were just as creative as we are today. Following the ranger program, attendees have the opportunity to independently explore the fort and participate in an optional art activity to create artwork as a reflection of the program.

NOTES: The total walking distance is about 1 mile. The interior of the fort is flat, has a brick walkway around both levels. The entrance to the fort has a 45-degree granite slope.

HIS131: THE HEYWARD FAMILY OF SOUTH CAROLINA

The Heyward family's history dates back to around 1670 when Daniel Heyward, an immigrant, settled in the Charles Towne colony. Two of his great-grandsons, Daniel Heyward and Thomas Heyward, established rice plantations in the Old House area (now Ridgeland, Jasper County) among others in the South Carolina low country. Thomas Heyward, Jr, signer of the Declaration of Independence, contributed heavily to American history during the Revolutionary War, serving in several key battles in the South.

HIS111: COLONIAL HILTON HEAD: THIS WAS THE FRONTIER



1 Session | Monday | Nov 10 | 10:30AM-12:30PM In-Person | Hilton Head Campus

This course explores what Hilton Head Island and the surrounding Lowcountry looked like during the colonial era, from the arrival of the Spanish in 1521 through the year 1800. While many popular stories of Hilton Head's early history focus on the post-Revolutionary period and the early 19th century, the colonial era is rich with lesser-known, fascinating accounts. Spanish, French, English, Scottish, and Irish colonists arrived over time, bringing with them enslaved Africans of various nationalities who labored alongside enslaved Native peoples. The true history of the colonial Lowcountry is vast, complex, and still largely hidden from public knowledge.



Dr. KATHERINE SEEBER is an archaeologist who has worked in the Lowcountry for over a decade.



HIS116: A RADICAL IDEA: THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

Learn how the writings of John Locke (government to secure peace and protect unalienable rights), Montesquieu (separation of powers and checks and balances), and Jean-Jacques Rousseau (individual liberty and the social contract) significantly influenced the Founding Fathers as they crafted the Constitution and established a new government. Explore how the Magna Carta created the legacy of due process and the pursuit of life, liberty, and property. Also, learn about the Constitutional Convention of 1787 (Virginia Plan vs. New Jersey Plan) and the conflicts between Federalists and Anti-Federalists, including Federalist Papers No. 10 and 51.

HIS117: UNINVITED GUESTS OF THE GERMAN LUFTWAFFE - POW

This program introduces attendees to 28,000 Eighth Air Force airmen who became "uninvited guests of the German Luftwaffe (LW)" as POWs during WWII. These collective experiences will be told by Al Pela, Jr., as seen through the eyes of his father, Al Pela Sr., who spent six months in Stalag Luft IV Lager and another three months marching across Germany in the harsh winter of 1945. This program includes LW processing (you'll have an opportunity to utilize dog tags) and a sampling of POW cuisine.

HIS118: THE COMING OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION 1760-1776

3 Sessions | Tuesdays | Oct 21, 28, Nov 4 10AM-12N | In-Person | Beaufort Campus



The class begins with a concise overview of the key forces, issues, institutions, and personalities that created the conditions for the colonies' rebellion against the British crown. It then examines the aftermath of the Seven Years' War, including the crown's efforts to raise revenue and the colonists' growing resistance. The course traces the escalating tensions, deepening mistrust, and the ideological beliefs that shaped the American perspective, culminating in the decision to convene the Continental Congress and ultimately declare independence.
