oped into innovative drugs. D'Antonio said the team's goal is to screen 30,000 small-molecule compounds against "a critically important target protein" in SARS-CoV-2 to see how they affect the protein's functionality. At USCB's main campus in Bluffton, D'Antonio, Shane and Skip are spending long hours in the lab, growing and purifying the target protein to a high yield. D'Antonio said after initial testing, the researchers will send a large batch of the coronavirus protein to research partners at Laboratório Nacional de Biociências in Campinas, Brazil, for more experiments — hopefully by late spring.

The Future is Now: USCB Goes High Tech For History



“My students are working on real digital projects currently in development at USCB that will be for the public,” said Dr. Brent Morris, who teaches digital history and is director of the USCB Institute for the Study of the Reconstruction Era. “If you can harness technology that is second nature for students who were born into a digital world, that’s how you get people’s attention.”

Using a 360-degree camera to take photos is one of the first steps in building the virtual reality tours. **Liz Erickson**, a USCB sophomore majoring in history, swung one around recently on the university’s Bluffton campus to learn how it works. The software that comes with the camera stitches together multiple photos or videos captured by separate lenses, and the selfie stick disappears when the images are merged. Digital technologies make Beaufort County’s rich history accessible for more people, said **Tucker Perry**, a senior from Summerville who is majoring in History. For their virtual tour projects, students can choose to spotlight Mitchellville or one of the many sites in Northern Beaufort County’s new Reconstruction Era National Historic Park, a component of the National Park System.



These sites include the Emancipation Oak, where freed slaves witnessed the first reading of the Emancipation Proclamation; Camp Saxton, where African-American volunteers trained for service in the Union army; and Darrah Hall at Penn Center, among others.

Virtually There: How Two Classes Connected Across the Atlantic During COVID-19



USCB French classes teamed up with Professor Nathalie Callies from the *Université de Paris-Nanterre’s-Institut Universitaire de Technologie* to fill the gap when both universities’ study abroad programs were cancelled this year due to the pandemic. The two trans-Atlantic groups of students (4 sections from UofParis, 2 sections from USCB) had joint classes and used “Two Truths and a Lie,” to enhance class foreign language conversations. **Olayah Safouan**, USCB Student Government Association-Secretary/Treasurer, told the French students that she was Moroccan, had family in Paris and owned a cat. The Parisians chose correctly that the feline was pure fiction. USCB Psychology major **Gabrielle Idsall** summed up the experience of the virtual exchange when she said, “We are social beings, and we need human interactions. This has been a refreshing experience for us all.” Professor Callies said, “It was for my students a way to travel and dive into another culture, getting the opportunity to talk with the American youth beyond stereotypes, enjoying their common points and differences.”




